The Department of Human Services' Division of Aging Services will hold a listening session to allow New Jersey residents to provide input into the state's plans for services to older residents for 2021-2025. State Units on Aging, including Human Services, are required to submit service plans to the U.S. Administration for Community Living/Administration on Aging every four years. The plans detail service needs, establish priorities, and outline how each state plans to utilize federal Older Americans Act and state funding to accomplish established goals. Anyone interested in aging issues may attend the session.
